

Golf Advisory Board  
Regular Meeting  
May 22, 2019

Members in attendance were Dan Birnley (Men's Rep.), Claudia McNair (Women's Rep.), Dimery Plewe (Youth Rep.), Golf Course Superintendent Tom Kramlich, and Director of Parks and Recreation Dean Palmquist.

No guests were in attendance.

The meeting was called to order by Dan Birnley at 7:06 AM with the minutes approved from the April 24, 2019, advisory board meeting.

**Pro Report** – Micah shared with Dean, prior to the meeting, that our golf course has been selected by the Colorado High School Sports and Activities Association to host next year's regional high school girls' golf tournament on May 4 & 5, 2020 with an anticipated eleven teams golfing in this event. This is a great honor for our golf course to host a regional high school tournament and speaks highly of what other communities think about our golf course. Micah had given Dean a golf course revenue report, and revenues are down approximately 4% from last year at \$197,313 this year versus \$205,941 last year.

**Staff Report** – Tom shared that the golf course has had over two inches of rain for this past month and 1.5 inches within the last couple of days. He also mentioned that the soil temperatures are 3.5 weeks behind, compared to last year. Tom mentioned that he is fully staffed this year with three full-time employees, including himself, and seven seasonal employees. With everything growing so fast, Tom said that the new rough mower has been going out every day, though it has had some maintenance issues and the old rough mower has had some maintenance issues, as well. Tom mentioned that both greens rollers will be used in the coming weeks. Dean and Tom discussed the memorial flagpole project with the advisory board members in starting to get some preliminary pricing and ideas of what that will look like. More information about the memorial flagpole project will be shared at future advisory board meetings.

**Men's Association Report** – Dan shared that the CMGA Men's Club Championship will be held on July 27 & 28 and the CMGA Senior Club Championship will be held on September 14 & 15. Dan mentioned that the CMGA by-laws are being updated to better reflect how they are currently conducting business. Dan also shared that the men's association has been educated on tree removal around the greens and are supportive about any tree removal around the greens that impact the quality of the green, such as hole #16 green. Some discussion ensued about the removal of the three trees on the west side of hole #16 green.

**Women's Association Report** – Claudia said that the women's golf association will start match play in June and will be allowing high school girls to play in all of their tournaments, where in prior years that has not been allowed.

**At-Large Report** – No report.

**Youth Report**- Dimery reported that the local girls' high school golf team placed seventh out of fifteen teams at the Girls' State Golf Tournament. Dimery was asked what she placed, and she shared that she tied for eighth place. Well done Dimery!!! Dimery shared that the Junior Golf Camp will be held from June 3<sup>rd</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup>.

**Council Report** – No report.
